Robin delayed scan to play gig

Bee Gee Robin Gibb refused to visit doctors for vital scans that could have detected his illness because he wanted to go on tour.

Gibb, 62, died in May after a long battle with colon and

liver cancer. His widow Dwina, 59, said yesterday that the legendary star initially ignored her pleas and doctors' advice to have the cancerous cells fully checked.

Robin's illness was first discovered in October 2010 after surgeons removed an intestinal blockage.

He was supposed to have regular checks but Dwina said she and her son Robin John, 29, were unable to persuade him to drop his musical commitments.

She said: "He didn't want to stop though I said, 'Please just have the scan."
"Despite all his wonderful

ways, Robin could be very stubborn and he never liked bad news - he just didn't want to know.

'He went to do a show in New Zealand as they'd just experienced an earthquake. "Maybe it was important for him to do that show, but it

was still important for him to have his scans.'

The songwriter toured for more than a fortnight during November 2010.

By the time he went in for a check-up, the tumour had spread to blood vessels.

Dwina said his last days were cherished by his family. She added: "We ended up

having a wonderful few weeks with him."
